### Development Highlights

#### Training for JSWM members and secretaries

**Title of the Training: Capacity Building on Integrated Watershed Management of Watershed Development Committee Members of Santhal Pargana of Jharkhand state.**

Gramin Vikas Trust - Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Godda had organized a three days residential cum on-campus training programme including Exposure visit on “**Capacity Building of Integrated Watershed Management of Watershed Development Committee Members of Santhal Pargana,**” from 11<sup>th</sup> -13<sup>th</sup> January 2013.

#### **Objectives of the training Programme:**

- To build up the capacity on accounting procedure & book keeping of watershed committee members



- To develop the entrepreneurship capacity for livelihood of the rural youth/farmers in vegetable production, seed production, vermi composting, mushroom production & marketing in the watershed area

- To provide the guidelines for implementation of the programme with participatory mode with all stakeholders in the project

- To strengthen the technical inputs for soil & water management

- To provide the guidelines for linkage with other line departments to Water Conservation

**Day 1<sup>st</sup> (11.01.2013):** The training programme was inaugurated by the Programme Coordinator, Dr. Ravi Shankar, Gramin Vikas Trust – Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Godda in the presence of SMSs and members of different watershed committee of Deoghar and Jamtara districts. At first he welcomed the participants and during his address he focused on the development of watershed area by adopting holistic approach, so that, the development may be sustainable and the five factors (viz. land, water, people, forest and animals essential for life may be available to the next generation without their deterioration in quality. Before starting the training a pre training evaluation was conducted to know the knowledge status of the participants about the subject of the training programme.

After the inaugural session Mr. A. P. Thakur and Mr. R. R. K. Singh of GVT – KVK gave the tips to create awareness among the beneficiaries of the watershed area. They described in

detail about the methods of base line survey. They also suggested them to make planning of each and every programme before implementing it in the field.



In the second half session Dr. Ravi Shankar described in detail about the various schemes of the government like SGSY, ATMA, RKVY, NABARD, NHM etc. for the development of poor communities through dove telling the schemes around the watershed area as per the need and requirement of the beneficiaries. His main focus was on the convergence of some schemes in the watershed area for more development of the beneficiaries of watershed activities.

**Day 2<sup>nd</sup> (12.01.2013):** The training programme of second day was started with the lecture of Mr. Kunal Prasad, Technical Expert, WCDC, Godda. He described the integrated approach of watershed development. He also highlighted the various causes of soil erosion, methods of soil and water conservation with the help of a power point presentation. After their presentation a discussion for about 30 minutes was held to answer the queries raised by the president and secretary of the various watershed committees. For better perception of watershed and integrated development of watershed area a video film on watershed development was also shown to the trainees.



**Day 3<sup>rd</sup> (13.01.2013):** The training programme of the last day was started with the exposure visit in the morning at 8.00 AM. Various demonstration units of GVT – KVK like seed processing unit, piggery unit, etc. were visited by the participants under the guidance of R. R. K. Singh. He described in detail about the process of seed processing unit. Participants were made acquainted with the new breed of pig i.e. T & D. The character of the breed was also described by the R. R. K. Singh. The participants were also taken to the seed production field of mustard (var. Pusa Mahak), pigeonpea (Var. NDA – 1) and vegetables. The particular variety of pigeonpea is found to be resistant against wilt disease which is a major constraint in the pigeonpea production in the district.



At 10.00 AM the participants were gathered again in the training hall of GVT – KVK and whole day they

were taught about the accounting process by Mr. B. D. Singh, Accountant (KVK-GVT)

Accounting & book keeping is an important responsibility of all stake holders implementing the project. During the training he provided the idea of keeping following books:

- Cheque book
- Cash book
- Bank pass book
- voucher's & folder
- Measurement book
- Master roll
- Stock book
- Livelihood activities book
- Advance book, etc.



In the evening of the third day a post training evaluation was conducted to know the impact of training. After evaluation valedictory function was organized. During valedictory function each participant was awarded with a certificate. At the last, vote of thanks was proposed before concluding the training programme.
