

A Three-day Residential Training Programme on “WADI Management for Holistic Development of the Tribal Families” from 18 – 20 March, 2013



Gramin Vikas Trust – Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Godda had organized a three-day residential training programme for the 14 officers of Gramin Vikas Trust posted at West Bengal and Orissa on “WADI Management for Holistic Development of the Tribal Families” from 18.03.2013 to 20.03.2013 at GVT – KVK, Godda (Jharkhand).

The training programme was inaugurated by the District Development Manager (NABARD), Shri Mrinal Ranjan on 18.03.2013 by lightening the lamp in the presence of Dr. Ravi Shanker, Programme Coordinator, GVT – KVK, Godda; Shri C. P. Chakrawarty, Manager (HR), GVT (E), Ranchi and other staff members of GVT –



KVK along with the participants of the training programme. Dr. Ravi Shanker welcomed the dignitaries and the participants on behalf of Gramin Vikas Trust – Krishi Vigyan



Kendra, Godda. Shri C. P. Chakrawarty cited the importance of the training programme for the officers of GVT. DDM (NABARD) also addressed the participants and emphasized on the importance of WADI programme funded by NABARD for the tribal families. At the end of the inaugural function Shri C. P. Chakrawarty

delivered the vote of thanks to the dignitaries and participants.

After the inaugural function, technical session of first day started with the lecture of Shri C. P. Chakrawarty on the topic, “Awareness, Motivation and Social mobilization”. He presented the lecture with the help of power point presentation and dealt



with various issues of awareness and motivation. He emphasized on the change and its

learning like, be alert for the first sign of change, anticipated change even when things are going right, keep renewing yourself etc. Regarding motivation, he mentioned about motivation cycle, nature of motivation, classification of needs, theory of human motivation, etc.

During second half of the session, Shri Raj Pal Singh presented and described in detail about new techniques of the agricultural crop production. He had described in detail about the methods of System of Rice intensification (SRI) & System of Wheat Intensification (SWI) for enhancing the productivity and profitability of the farming communities. He laid emphasis on the cultivation of pigeonpea for the protein security to the communities.



His emphasis was on the variety NDA – 1 because of its higher productivity and resistance against fungal wilt disease which is one of the major biotic constraints of the pigeonpea production. He also described and showed the participants the photograph of multilayer vegetable cropping system with the help of power point presentation. He has shown that how the cucurbits (bitter gourd, bottle gourd, ridge gourd etc.) are grown with elephant foot yam in single piece of land.



On the second day, an exposure visit was arranged for the participants of the training programme. The participants visited the WADI villages like Sundermore, Tilabad, Bansjori, Kauadab with Dr. Ravi Shanker, PC, GVT – KVK, Godda; Sri Raj Pal Singh, SMS (Agro);

Shri C. P. Chakrawarty, Manager (HR), GVT. In the villages they had seen the plots of mango and discussed with the beneficiaries and critically analysed the various issues. Shri C. K. Ray, WADI Incharge, Godda was also present. They have also visited the Nipania village where bamboo crafts are being prepared under NAIP of GVT – KVK, Godda. In the evening they have returned GVT – KVK, Godda.





The third day (20.03.2013) technical session started with the lecture of Shri C. P. Chakrawarty on the topic “Communication skill in context with organizational development”. In his lecture he defined the communication, its methodology and impact. He also described the causes of conflicts and its resolution, key elements of employee satisfaction. He also

focussed on the philosophy and causes of organizational development.

DDM (NABARD), Godda, Sri Mrinal Ranjan too delivered his a lecture on the topic,

“Financial inclusion, NABARD programme and formation of SHG/Federation”. In his lecture, he focussed on the importance of financial inclusion of each and every beneficiary because now the Government has started to transfer the subsidy amount to the bank account of beneficiaries. He also informed them about the other benefits of



financial inclusion and about different programmes of NABARD like seed production, micro irrigation, formation of groups, WADI, etc. He advised that the success of any programme depends on the participation of the beneficiaries and the project implementing agency. Communication with beneficiaries is the first step to start any programme.

After the lecture of DDM (NABARD), Dr. H. K. Chaurasia, SMS (Horticulture), GVT – KVK, Godda took a lecture on various management tactics of mango orchard, other



horticultural crops and the new dimension of horticulture. During his lecture, his focus was on to dig the pit of proper size and proper nutritional management for better growth of the plants. During summer, he advocated the use of mulching with polythene, saw dust, paddy straw, leaves of plant etc. for less evaporation of water from the root zone of the plant because there is

lack of water during summer season. He advised to make a thatched roof above the plant to save them against the scorching sunlight.

In the after lunch session, Mr. K. K. Singh, SMS (Plant Breeding), GVT – KVK, Godda emphasized to manage the natural resources like land, air, water, vegetation etc. for their availability in future without degradation in their quality in his presentation. He started his lecture with the vision and the mandate of NRM (Natural resource Management). His focus was on to manage the agro forestry and methods of farming like organic farming, rainfed farming etc. for their sustainability. He also described about seed drill, SRI, weed management, etc. for conserving the resources. He also told them about the potential and prospects of organic farming for resource poor farmers.



In the last session of last day training programme, Dr. Surya Bhushan, SMS (Plant Protection) had delivered a power point presentation on the Integrated Pest Management of horticultural crops. He described the various categories of pesticides and their usages in



different crops. Integrated Pest Management modules of mango, tomato, brinjal, etc. were described in detail. He emphasized on the application of bio pesticides like neem seed kernel extract, bacteria, virus, and fungus in pest management. Chemical pesticide should be applied as last option and it may be used when

other option fails. He suggested growing marigold with tomato, saunf, coriander with brinjal, etc. to minimize the damage from fruit borer in tomato and shoot and fruit borer in brinjal respectively.

Before closing half an hour was provided to the participants of the training programme to present their views about the training programme. Many of the participants presented their views positively and also appraised about the WADI programme of Godda run by Gramin Vikas Trust in the presence of DDM (NABARD) and other dignitaries.





In the last, Dr Ravi Shanker, Programme Coordinator, GVT – KVK, Godda extended vote of thanks to all the participants, staff of GVT – KVK, Godda, Manager (HR), GVT and DDM (NABARD) for participating and make this programme successful.
