NATURAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT



NATURAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT

Within the domain of Natural Resource Management (NRM), Gramin Vikas Trust (GVT) has undertaken extensive endeavors encompassing soil and water conservation, agricultural research and extension, animal husbandry, diversified agriculture, and capacity building. Notably, GVT has spearheaded various flagship theme-based projects such as WADI, Watershed, Agriculture Research and Extension, and Livestock Management/Animal Husbandry. Under the ambit of NRM, our activities include:

A. WADI (WASTELAND AREA DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE)

Under the banner of the WADI initiative, sponsored by NABARD, Gramin Vikas Trust (GVT) is executing homestead farming projects. This approach, rooted in agro-horticulture, serves as a Sustainable Land Management (SLM) intervention, featuring small orchards with intercropping. The project is dedicated to establishing small fruit orchards and rehabilitating depleted land through ecological interventions and soil conservation measures. The orchards comprise fruit crops such as mango, pomegranate, cashew, lemon, guava, aonla, supplemented by forestry species planted along the boundaries of land holdings.



During the fiscal year 2021-22, Gramin Vikas Trust successfully concluded plantation efforts for 425 WADI projects across Gujarat and Bihar, spanning 35 villages. Additionally, we are overseeing the maintenance of a total of 2,856 WADI projects under the NABARD TDF Project and the TDD Government of Gujarat initiative, covering approximately 2,590 hectares of land.

The key outcomes of the WADI program encompass the productive utilization of wastelands and marginal lands, expansion of fruit crop cultivation, conservation of water and soil resources, reduction in migration, enhancement of social status, creation of self-employment opportunities for rural populations, and the promotion of community involvement in decision-making processes.



NATURAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT

B. INTEGRATED WATERSHED MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME (IWMP)

- Gramin Vikas Trust (GVT) has garnered considerable expertise in watershed development and management through projects supported by **DFID and the Government of India** across rain-fed regions in Eastern and Western India. These initiatives entail intensive Natural Resource Management activities, including Soil & Water Conservation, Water Resource Development, Joint Forest Management, and the formation of user beneficiaries' groups.
- The watershed approach encompasses various measures from **ridge to valley treatment, contouring, and staggered trenches** to gully plugs and check dams.
- Furthermore, GVT ensures rigorous training of community leaders in **Participatory Watershed Management** to bolster sustainability. Implementation of the Tree and Agroforestry Programme targets wastelands and homestead areas.
- For Water Resources Development (WRD), the focus lies on revitalizing existing water harvesting structures and constructing new ones such as **farm ponds, earthen storage tanks, flexi-dams, and dug wells**, prioritizing small, cost-effective, and labor-intensive structures.
- An exemplar is the **Kitchen Garden project in Dumgo village panchayat** Kunjbona, Block Littipara District Pakur under the JTELP Project, Littipara, Pakur, Jharkhand, aimed at maximizing vegetable yield in limited land space.

C. AGRO-FORESTRY



Gramin Vikas Trust (GVT) has executed numerous projects focused on alleviating poverty among marginalized communities through a social mobilization approach to Natural Resource Management (NRM) for sustainable livelihoods. These projects were designed with the explicit goal of socio-economic upliftment for forest-based and forest fringe villagers, emphasizing the optimal utilization of resources through efficient management and technological interventions.

D. AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH AND EXTENSION

Indian farmers face numerous emerging challenges in agricultural activities, including constraints such as limited land and water availability, compounded by natural resource degradation, climate variability, and shifts in demand and consumption patterns. To address these issues, Gramin Vikas Trust (GVT) has undertaken Crop Research Programs employing Participatory Varietal Selection (PVS) and Client Oriented Breeding (COB). Through these initiatives, GVT has developed, released, and recommended specific varieties tailored to the requirements of farmers in rainfed regions. Notable examples include paddy varieties Ashoka 200F (BVD 109) and Ashoka 228 (BVD 110), as well as the maize variety GM-6. Seed Multiplication Programs have facilitated widespread adoption of these varieties among rainfed farmers, with GVT extending its coverage to approximately 41,500 hectares of agricultural land through its research endeavors.

E. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY/LIVESTOCK DEVELOPMENT



Livestock plays a pivotal role in completing the farming system, serving as more than just a source of draught power for land management and manure for crop production. It also ensures income and nutritional food security for impoverished communities. Beyond providing milk and meat, livestock contributes to the empowerment of rural women by fostering financial independence and decision-making capabilities. Key activities encompass goat rearing, poultry farming, and piggery. GVT has orchestrated over 1,400 veterinary health awareness camps, benefiting over 300,000 milch animals, while also distributing in excess of 138,000 chicks and 10,000 goats to tribal families in rainfed areas. Additionally, GVT has constructed over 500 feed mangers to reduce fodder quantity and enhance food quality.

In 2021 -22 we have Distributed 17 Goatery units, 15 Poultry unit Kadak Nath for IGA and Breed Improvement. Two Veterinary Camps organized

SKILL ENHANCEMENT & LIVELIHOOD

Gramin Vikas Trust (GVT) subscribes to the belief that skill development fosters a 'virtuous circle', wherein the quality and relevance of education and training for both women and men drive innovation, investment, technological advancement, enterprise growth, economic diversification, and competitiveness. These factors, in turn, accelerate job creation, essential for robust economies. Our skill programs are divided into Placement-linked Trainings and Capacity Building Trainings. GVT recognizes skill development as pivotal in catalyzing sustainable development, offering marginalized rural youths a sustainable income source and addressing the evolving demands of globalization and technological advancements. Leveraging its experience and collaborative network, GVT has honed its expertise to deliver skill development training across various sectors. Over the past decade, GVT has trained rural youths and school dropouts from marginalized communities in construction, motor driving, mechanics, hospitality, and Information and Communication Technology (ICT). Additionally, GVT operates a Vocational Training Centre (VTC) in Dahod, a flagship initiative of the Government of Gujarat in partnership with KRIBHCO under PPP.

In the year 2021-2022 18 trainings implemented with covering 271 no. of youth in 45 villages. 225 Youth opportunities provided

Notably, GVT has successfully completed

- 3 major skill projects in Rajasthan, Gujarat, and Jharkhand under the aegis of DDU-GKY.
- To date, under the Placement-linked Skill Development program, GVT has trained approximately 20,726 individuals and secured placements for over 17,225 trainees.

SKILL ENHANCEMENT & LIVELIHOOD

INSTITUTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Institutional development aims to establish and enhance the structural units and capabilities of institutions, thereby augmenting their impact and effectiveness. Gramin Vikas Trust (GVT) has been instrumental in establishing numerous Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs) and Self Help Groups (SHGs) in project areas, comprising members from marginalized socio-economic backgrounds. GVT dedicates meticulous efforts to foster income-generating groups with a focus on social and financial inclusion. The self-help mechanism and mutual aid ethos persist, evolving in response to contemporary needs. Across nine states in India, GVT is executing the Formation & Promotion of Farmer Producers Organization program, registering 25 FPOs in the latest fiscal year. To date, approximately 20,000 groups have been developed under various flagship programs such as watershed initiatives, WADI, agriculture, and Women SHG Project training. These groups gain access to project funds and other financing opportunities from developmental banks and institutions, fostering financial inclusion and commercial sustainability. GVT also actively organizes groups for income-generating activities to ensure their long-term viability. Furthermore, GVT has garnered significant expertise in capacity building for Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs) and their representatives.



During the fiscal year 2021-2022, a total of 25 Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs) were established and registered across four states: Rajasthan (11), Uttar Pradesh (8), Himachal Pradesh (4), and Jammu (2). These FPOs collectively attracted 4,249 members, with Rajasthan accounting for 2,910, Uttar Pradesh for 852, Himachal Pradesh for 218, and Jammu & Kashmir for 149 members. The total share amount deposited by members amounted to Rs 49.67 lakh. Additionally, five Women Self Help Groups (WSHGs) were formed, with a total of 75 women joining these groups.

DEVELOPMENT STUDIES

Gramin Vikas Trust (GVT) consistently engages in studying the developmental processes and challenges faced by underserved sections and regions. These studies inform the design and implementation of projects based on community demand, with approaches ranging from descriptive, exploratory, interpretative, applied, to action-oriented studies. GVT conducts comprehensive assessments including Need Assessments, Baseline Surveys, and Monitoring & Evaluation to gauge project impact and progress. Collaborating with various agencies such as NREGA, ADANI, NTPC, CHIRAG, LANCO, Hindustan Cooper Limited, CFCL, Forest Development Agencies, and the Ministry of Panchayati Raj, GVT conducts field-based surveys and documents case studies, reports, and success stories across diverse thematic areas. Over 362 development studies have been undertaken, covering approximately 87 districts and impacting around 32,500 families.

Notable projects include preparing Detailed Project Reports (DPR) and providing facilitation and capacity building for high-impact mega projects, as well as conducting Impact and Need Assessment Studies for initiatives like the NPCIL Ravatbhata project in Rajasthan, benefitting 1550 project beneficiaries across 132 CSR villages.

HEALTH & SANITATION

Gramin Vikas Trust (GVT) has significantly addressed HIV/AIDS risks among Female Sex Workers in Jharkhand. In Rajasthan, over 850 toilets were built through the Public-Private-Community model. Additionally, 3000 IHHLs were constructed in Bihar, Rajasthan, and West Bengal through CSR funding. GVT also delivered 600 school toilet blocks in Bihar and Madhya Pradesh, benefiting over 300,000 beneficiaries through health and sanitation programs. GVT facilitated and implemented major projects.

JAL JEEVAN MISSION (JJM)

This program holds immense significance for rural areas, aiming to ensure "water in every home" and alleviate health expenses related to waterborne ailments. The Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) stands as a flagship initiative of the Government, prioritizing the provision of clean tap water to every household. GVT has been designated as Implementing Support Agency (ISA) in various states. To promote water management awareness, GVT conducts diverse activities such as Gram Sabha, Jan Sabha, Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA), Social and Resource Mapping, Geo-tagging, distribution and training on Field Testing Kits (FTK), Har Ghar Jal initiatives, Song & Drama performances, wall writings, melas, school rallies, pamphlet distribution, and training sessions on various water-related issues.

JJM - RATLAM

In 15 villages of Ratlam district of MP State we have completed Baseline survey, Jan Sabha, Gram Sabha, PRA, Geo-tagging, FTK water quality training, VWSC training, Exposure Visit etc.

JJM - RAJASTHAN

To engage the community, JJM teams in Jaipur, Banswara, and Jodhpur organized awareness camps, meetings, Gram Sabhas, Participatory Rural Appraisals (PRAs), household surveys, and collected community contributions in villages. Throughout these activities, GVT staff disseminated information about the JJM Project.

JJM - UTTAR PRADESH

As the Implementing Support Agency (ISA) for the JJM Project in Hapur district, GVT operates in Dhaulana, Hapur, and Shimbhawali Blocks, covering 160 Gram Panchayats and 196 villages. In Ghaziabad, we work in Rajapur and Bhojpur Blocks, spanning 81 Gram Panchayats and 98 villages. Additionally, in Gautambudhnagar, we operate in Jewar and Bhisrakh Blocks, covering 37 Gram Panchayats and 51 villages. In Bagpat district, our operations extend to Bagpat, Binoli, Chapori, and Pilana Blocks. Major activities include meetings with Gram Panchayats, men, and women, Participatory Rural Appraisals (PRAs), formation of Village Water and Sanitation Committees (VWSC), preparation of Village Action Plans (VAP), community mobilization for water conservation, contribution collection, opening Capex and Opex accounts, and Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) work.

JJM - JAMMU & KASHMIR

GVT is facilitating as ISA in JJM Project in 7 district of Jammu and Kashmir State with the coverage of 48 Blocks and 758 Villages . Main Activities carried out under the project are Awareness camps , Revival of VWSCs, Preparation of VAP and Bank Accounts opened etc .

EDUCATIONAL REFORMS

GVT has been committed to delivering high-quality education and skill development programs to underprivileged children and youth residing in remote and marginalized areas across India. Our initiatives encompass computer training, Baalbadi, primary education, and soft skills training. Additionally, we enhance educational resources by distributing solar lamps and beautifying Anganwadis and primary schools. Collaborating with various welfare organizations, GVT offers skill development training to rural youth, subsequently facilitating their placement in suitable jobs.

To date, GVT has provided educational training to 3,500 candidates, facilitated the enrollment of over 8,000 children in primary schools, and distributed solar lamps to 150,000 children in areas facing power outages. Moreover, GVT has established Agri Clinic Centers to further its educational endeavors.

AGRI CLINIC CENTRE

In order to educate farmers and offer consultancy regarding government schemes, as well as facilitate their access to scheme benefits, we initiated the Agri Clinic Centre in Lather, Bundu, Medaninagar, and Jagannathpur under the Ranchi Zonal office. Over 1700 farmers have availed benefits from various government schemes through this initiative.

SOCIAL ENTERPRISES & MARKET ACCESS

GVT has spearheaded social entrepreneurship training, empowering individuals and groups through supportive mentorship programs. Leveraging its extensive experience in the agriculture sector, GVT has enhanced the capacity of farmer producer groups, spanning from seed production to post-harvesting, ensuring marketability for sustainable livelihoods. GVT fosters and bolsters various skill-based businesses in service provision, production, processing, and marketing of agricultural and non-agricultural products. Furthermore, GVT connects these social entrepreneurs with new business opportunities, aiming for independent viability. To enhance access and control over seed production and marketing, seed producers were integrated into Seed Producers groups, evolving into a registered Seed Producers Group Company under the amended Company Act of 2002. This hybrid model combines cooperative spirit with corporate efficiency, fostering greater autonomy and profitability.
