






























GRAMIN VIKAS TRUST

Gramin Vikas Trust has started its journey in the year 1992 as a National Level Non-profit development organization with the active support from Krishak Bharati Cooperative Ltd (KRIBHCO), Department of Fertilizers, GOI and DFID (UK). GVT is directed by a Board of Trustees, which includes five Trustees from KRIBHCO, two Trustees from Ministry of Chemicals & Fertilizers, Government of India. and three nominated eminent Trustees from diverse and eminent background. So far, GVT has partnered with various department of Central and State Governments, National Rainfed Area Authority, World Bank, Indian NABARD, Council of Agricultural Research Rockefeller Foundation, (ICAR), Asian Development Bank, European Commission, Central and State Public Sector Enterprises, Private Corporate houses like NTPC, RCF, IPL, NFL, CFCL, PFC, POWERGRID, GAIL, BPCL, ONGC, IOCL, EESL, SUN Pharmaceuticals, Larsen & Toubro, LANCO, HDFC- Mumbai, PTC Foundation, IIT Mumbai, Grant Thornton India LLP and a number of philanthropic and developmental agencies in implementing livelihood developmental and programs particularly in projects geographies. GVT acts as knowledge repository and over the time have built up internal implementing methodologies, capacity, novel interventions and innovative approaches for convergence inclusive and sustainable poverty alleviation and improved livelihood on enterprise mode. Gramin Vikas Trust has a well-endowed Academic Field Oriented Research Educational and Training Institute in Ratlam in Madhya Pradesh; known by the name- National Livelihood

Resources Institute (NLRI). NLRI is also managing an AICTE approved School of Rural Management (SRM), which has been offering two years post graduate diploma in Rural Planning and Management.

In eastern India GVT manages one Krishi Vigyan Kendra at Dist. Godda, Jharkhand, which is as per ICAR, one of the best leading organizations Frontline Demonstration and of latest Dissemination and appropriate agricultural, livestock and other income generating farmbased activities Gramin Vikas Trust has undertaken monitoring and evaluation work, implementation work, impact assessment and various studies related to rural transformation gearing up to grow and make the organization visible in a competitive environment through its relentless efforts. GVT has been successful in bringing sustainable change in the lives of millions of rural poor and has empowered them to lead a dignified life. We are successfully scaling-up in different states and trying to build and enhance resilience of vulnerable communities by restoring natural capacities, enabling resources, empowerment, socio-economic environmental sustainability, robust village institutions, and functional governance systems. GVT has expanded its operation in 13,354 villages of 122 districts in 22 states and 3 union Territories of the country with household coverage of 26,70,800.

GVT is implementing and managing 109 WADI (orchards) projects, and has impacted 23,539 rural households. Under the Wataershed programme, GVT has restored 1,74,000 hectares of wasted land

covering about 21 lakh beneficiaries in different states of the country.

Under the National Jal Jeevan Mission, GVT will be working as a national level Key Resource Centre at PAN India level to capacitate institutions and communities for drinking water, functional household tap connections and other essential **GVT** has components. recognized as CBBO partners for PAN India by SFAC and NAFED as well as in 9 states by NABARD and NCDC for formation and promotion of Farmer Producers Organization.

GVT in collaboration with HDFC Bank 'PARIVARTAN' has initiated a Holistic Rural Development Program (HRDP) in WEST Sikkim which is being executed in villages of 3 Blocks to improve the present water and agriculture situation in the villages and to sustain their socio- economic upliftment. Gramin Vikas Trust has been rewarded with various recognitions for its untiring efforts for more than two decades to capacitate and empower tribal, farmers and marginalized communities.



GEOGRAPHICAL PRESENCE



GVT mostly works in remotest villages where the terrain is hilly and undulating; receives less and erratic rainfalls; has barren and infertile land; and lacks physical and social infrastructure. The targeted communities mainly comprise tribal and other marginalized communities including women. We are currently working in twenty-two states of the country viz Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Odisha, Punjab, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Telangana, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, West Bengal and three Union Territories Delhi, Jammu & Kashmir and daman & Diu.




ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE


OUR THEMATIC AREAS



Natural Resource Management

Under Natural Resource Management, our teams encourage communities to undertake developmental activities by mobilizing, motivating and empowering people. Some of the major interventions carried out under NRM by GVT are: WADI (Wasteland Area Development Initiative) funded by NABARD, the programme focuses on development through agro-horticultural based intervention (Fruit Orchards) as a measure of Sustainable Land Management (SLM), which means small orchard with intercropping. Integrated Watershed Management Programme (IWMP), GVT has an appreciable experience in watershed development and management during the execution of project funded by DFID and Govt. of India in the rainfed areas of both Eastern and Western India. For Water Resources Development (WRD) the emphasis is given on the renovation of the existing water harvesting structures which lie dysfunctional in the villages for their optimum use. In addition, new water harvesting structures like farm pond, earthen storage tanks, flexi-dams, dug wells etc. are developed. Agro-Forestry aims at poverty alleviation of poor marginalized communities through social mobilization approach towards NRM for sustainable livelihoods. Socio economical upliftment, Capacity building and Skill development, Institutional mechanism are some of the major objectives of Agro-Forestry projects. Agricultural Research & Extension under the Crop Research Programs through Participatory Varietal Selection (PVS) and Client Oriented Breeding (COB), GVT has officially produced, released and recommended varieties that are highly adapted to the needs of farmers in the rainfed regions of India. These include paddy varieties Ashoka 200F (BVD 109) and Ashoka 228 (BVD 110); and maize variety GM-6. Seed Multiplication Programmes have aided maximum dissemination of these varieties amongst the farmers of the rainfed region. GVT has covered around 41,000 hectares of land under agriculture research till now. Animal Husbandry/Livestock Development GVT has so far organised more than 1,350 veterinary health camps covering more than 3 lakh milch animals and have also distributed more than 1,37,000 chicks and 9,700 goats to the tribal families of rainfed areas. Average increase in milk and other products among milch animals in post project intervention is about 47%.

Skill Development

In the rural settings across India parallel work of resource generation, capacity building and engagement of the masses along with highlighting of some important issues goes on. Our skill programs are categorized as Placement linked trainings and Capacity building trainings. Gramin Vikas Trust has trained rural youths and school dropouts from the marginalized communities in construction skills, motor driving, mechanics, hospitality, and Information and Communication Technology (ICT). GVT is implementing three major skill projects in Rajasthan, Gujarat and Jharkhand under the flagship of DDU-GKY. Under placement linked skill development GVT has trained around 20,445 candidates and provided placement to more than 17,000 trainees until now. GVT is also running a Vocational Training Centre (VTC) in Dahod- a flagship skill training programme of Government of Gujarat in collaboration with KRIBHCO, under PPP.





Institutional Development

GVT through Institutional Development seek to bring a critical perspective to applied real world problem which has been instrumental in forming a large number of Farmer Producer Organizations and Self Help Groups in its project areas consisting of members from marginal and deprived socio-economic status. GVT makes meticulous efforts in forming & promoting income generating groups with social and financial inclusion in the process of developing the same. Self-help mechanism and mutual aid have continued to develop and to be responsive to the demands of time. Through GVT's intervention in capacitating the beneficiaries SHG's are also encouraged to participate and get some training in animal husbandry, sheep and goat rearing, poultry, tailoring etc. GVT is implementing Formation & Promotion of Farmer Producers Organization programme in 9 states of India and has registered 47 number of FPOs in the respective financial year. More than 20,000 income generating groups under various flagship programmes like WADI, Agriculture, Watershed have been developed by Gramin Vikas Trust.





Development Studies

GVT brings a multi-disciplinary and collaborative approach in studying the development process and problems of the by-passed sections and regions by the mutual decisions and discussion to design and implement projects as per the demand. Descriptive study, Exploratory study, Interpretative study, Applied and Action oriented study are some of the development studies carried out so far. GVT has been conducting Need Assessment, Baseline surveys, Monitoring & Evaluation to assess the impact and progress of the projects being implemented. NREGA, NTPC, LANCO, Hindustan Cooper Limited, CFCL, Forest Development Agencies, Ministry of Panchayti Raj are some of the agencies for which GVT has carried out various field based surveys. GVT has also documented case studies, study reports and success stories based on various thematic areas. GVT has carried more than 362 development studies covering approximately 87 districts and around 32500 families.

In 2020-2021 12 trainings implemented in 03 states covering 1700 no. of youth in 132+villages.

Health and Sanitation

Health programmes are intended to support and protect families who are unable to meet basic health and sanitation standards coupled with poor medical facilities. Illiteracy, unawareness, immobility and cost are the reasons because of which many of these services do not reach the intended recipients. GVT ensures health and sanitation services are delivered equally to all the age groups in the informal sector with major emphasis on women and children through designing the mechanism of information dissemination, awareness generation and service delivery mechanism. Sanitation campaigns, capacity building for rural water supply scheme management, construction of toilet blocks, promotion and construction of cost effective & hygienic toilets, bio-digester toilets, purification of drinking water, cleanliness of water sources and inculcating good hygiene practices for preventive healthcare are some of the activities being carried out by GVT in the health & sanitation sector.

GVT has also worked extensively in the HIV/AIDS prone areas for reducing risks of Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs) among Female sex workers in the state of Jharkhand. GVT has constructed more than 850 toilets under Public-Private-Community (PPCP) model for households in Rajasthan. GVT has also constructed 3000 IHHLs in Bihar, Rajasthan, West Bengal under the CSR funding of Power Finance Corporation Limited. More than 600 school toilet blocks in states of Bihar and Madhya Pradesh were also delivered by GVT. More than 3,00,000 beneficiaries have been covered through health & sanitation programmes implemented so far.

In 2020-2021 29 awareness campaigns conducted in 13 states covering 11530 no. of beneficiaries in 54+ villages.

Education

GVT has been spearheading the movement to provide quality education and training to the vulnerable children and youth with educational and skill development programmes in the most remote and marginalized areas of India. Computer trainings, Baalbadi, Primary Education and Soft skills training are some of the programmes undertaken. GVT has also been working to ameliorate education and training resources by distributing solar lamps, Beautification of Anganwadis and Primary schools for better implementation of programs. In partnership with various welfare organizations GVT has provided training to rural youth followed by placement of candidates in the suitable jobs under the skill development programmes. So far GVT has provided educational training to 3500 candidates, Enrolment in primary schools to more than 8,000 children and 1,50,000 children with solar lamps in the most power outage locations.

In 2020-2021 3 FPOs and SHGs formed in Uttar Pradesh states covering 750 no. of women and men in 25+ villages.

In 2020-2021 12 capacity building trainings conducted in 04 states covering 1450 no. of beneficiaries in 20+ villages.

Social Entrepreneurship & Market Access

GVT has been a pioneer in social entrepreneurship training and has enabled various individuals and groups through support and mentorship programmes. GVT with its vast experience in agriculture sector has developed the capacity of producers groups of farmers from the very initial stage of seed production to post harvesting mechanism resulting to making the product potentially marketable to earn a decent livelihood. GVT promotes and supports various skill based businesses in service sector, production, processing and marketing of farm based products, handicrafts and other non-farm products. Moreover, depending upon the available opportunities GVT links these social entrepreneurs with new business opportunities with the objective of independently viable.

In order to ensure greater access and control over seed production and marketing of the same, seed producers were brought under the aegis of Seed Producers groups and these groups were transformed into a Seed Producers Group Company and registered under amended Company Act of 2002 under which the proposed company is a hybrid model of both cooperative spirit and corporate efficiency and is known as Producer Company

Climate action provides an exceptional opportunity to unlock massive economic and social benefits that can help us achieve the Sustainable Development Goals. Addressing the challenges of Environmental sustainability is imperative for Gramin Vikas Trust to fulfil its mandate and protect the world's most vulnerable climatic and environmental conditions. GVT has been implementing various Climate proofing, Biodiversity, Plastic waste management projects and Plantation projects. Gramin Vikas Trust has established under Section 25 company called Krishco Gramin Vikas Sanstha (KGVS). Gramin Vikas Trust has completed 820697 enrolments in RSBY and 22,30,349 enrolments in NPR. Gramin Vikas Trust has been working with various tribal and marginal target group who are dependent on the Forests for their livelihood. Gramin Vikas Trust aims at providing diversified opportunities for the respective beneficiaries with the aim of climate proofing and livelihood sustainability

In 2020-2021 02 states empanelled for Biodiversity programs with the target of impacting 5000+ no. of beneficiaries in 15+ villages in the 1st phase of project.

National Livelihood Resource Institute, Ratlam, Madhya Pradesh

A constituent institute of GVT promoted by KRIBHCO is a state-of-art institute of national repute spread in over 25 acres of land on the outskirts of the city of Ratlam in Bhadwasa Village in Jaora Block of Madhya Pradesh for institutionalizing our experience, training and knowledge management. NLRI provides consultancy on various developmental subjects to Madhya Pradesh State along with interactive training, participatory research and appreciative inquiry into the intricate interlinked world of rural livelihood.



School of Rural Management, Madhya Pradesh

Established in 2014 at Ratlam district of M.P with the aim of educating the rural youth under comprehensive Post Graduation Diploma in Management – Rural Management (PGDMRM), an AICTE recognized course which is considered at par with any management programmes across India. By far no institute in India is coordinating PGDM-RM course in rural/tribal belt which makes SRM first of its kind.

Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK) Godda Jharkhand

GVT is administering at Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK) Godda in Jharkhand since 2006 under the ICAR sponsored scheme for supporting KVKs in every district of the country. KVK Godda is pioneering experiments for popularizing piggery, goat rearing, dairy and FFV cultivation among the poor and marginalized farmers with the objective of making them self-reliant by increasing their incomes through one or more of such activities. Kisan Melas, Kisan Gosthis and Audio Visual shows are also conducted to benefit the larger number of farming communities about the important agricultural technologies that are found suitable to the areas.

Special attention was given to the HIV positive patients by arranging the requisite medicine at their door step






Visit of Chief Executive Officer, GVT, Latehar, Jharkhand

"I have a family of 5 members with 3 acres of land to cultivate for the living. I was growing Maize, Wheat, Soyabean and Gram with which I was able to generate Rs. 15,000/- annually from my regular farming practices. I was introduced to the WADI project by GVT team and they started visiting our village and conducted several meetings and trainings periodically soon after the orientation. I started growing Fruit Plant in 1 acre of land in the WADI field itself and cultivated Fruit plant in 40 Guntha of land. I also started planting Mango, Pomegranate and Lemon in my field under the guidance of GVT. After almost six years I earned more than Rs. 30,000/- with which I understood that change in the cropping pattern and adoption of new techniques brings a positive change in the livelihood and the overall pattern of farming. With time I also started giving guidance to other farmers for fruit plantation and increase their income generation capacity by 50%. I have earned Rs. 62,100/this time which has been not less than a dream for me. I am thankful from the bottom of my heart to GVT who guided me and trained me untiringly to explore best of my agriculture capacities and learn advanced farming practices"

Making a living through Mushroom Cultivation

"Unemployment was a big challenge to sustain for my living with responsibility of 6 family members. I generally spent time in helping my brother in farming/animal rearing or by sitting idle. I also migrated to different metro cities in search of job. Interaction and discussions were made with GVT Team on their field visit. After couple of weeks Training program was organized on the production technique of Oyster mushroom in which unemployed and youth population were motivated to participate the training. Soon after the training some of the farmers started the production of oyster mushrooms and were provided with technical assistance periodically. Through market linkage I was able to display the harvested packets of mushroom on the stalls of vegetable vendors. I also displayed my contact details on public places for the vendors to contact me for Oyster mushrooms. I also encouraged my wife to participate in the training on Oyster mushroom production being conducted by Maa Yogini Mahila Vikas Sangh Pathargamma NGO. My wife soon became part of one of the SHG formed. 125 female farmers (10 SHGs) were supervised by the facilitator of NGO and GVT - KVK Godda. In a time, span of 50 days (from harvesting to bagging) I earned Rs. 10,100/- as net return from the 100 bag of Oyster mushroom. I am thankful to GVT for giving new identity to me and my wife as entrepreneurs, which has not only given us a new life but new identity as an entrepreneur"

Aandhi Toofan Youth Group

"Under the JTELP Project, Aandhi Toofan Youth Group was formed in 2016 with 12 members under the aegis of the then District Project Manager Mr. Keshav Kishore Malik and Project Coordinator Mr. Mohan Kumar Singh in our village Tilabad Sunderpahadi Block. In the initial phase, the group members were less inclined towards the group because all the youth used to pay special attention to their domestic or agricultural work. After a few days, a total amount of Rs 40,000/- was received from DPMU Godda as seed capital in to the account of the Aandhi Toofan youth group. In the meeting, it was decided by the youth group that the collective business of Santhali traditional Garment should be done so that the engagement of all the members of the group would be continuous in the business as well as living conditions of the families of all the members can be enhanced. Santhali Traditional Garment business was started with a cost of Rs.1,10,000/- to do a collective business and for its large scale promotion and dissemination, it was started from the local market, craft fair and football field. At the same time, the time for buying and selling by the group member was also not getting enough due to their usual agriculture practicing. The members of the youth group were trained through various training and exposure visits, after which the understanding and interest of all the members increased significantly. Initially Santhali traditional Garment business "goods" were imported from Dumka Kathikund, after that the goods were brought from Odisha, Assam and Bihar. The youth group gradually expanded the Santali traditional garment business lining and the outlet of the Santhali traditional garment was opened and the business continued to flourish. In the year 2018, there was a conference of the state level youth group in which I got an opportunity to represent Aandhi Toofan youth group. The day was memorable for me as we got the privilege of installing Santhali traditional garment power loom machine. In today's time, Aandhi Toofan youth group is becoming financially empowered by becoming self-sufficient for livelihood. I on behalf of Aandhi Toofan Youth group is thankful to JTELP project that a good initiative has been taken to make youth aware and financially empowered"
